

REBREATHER DIVER **SPECIALTY**

Rebreathers used to be only for technical diving, but not anymore. Type R (recreational) Rebreather are lightweight, easy-to-transport, and have sophisticated electronics to simplify their use. Why dive a Rebreather? You get longer no stop limits, reduced gas consumption because you reuse most of your exhaled gas, and unmatched wildlife encounters because you don't release annoying bubbles. The PADI Rebreather Diver course introduces you to breather diving to a maximum depth of 18 metres/60 feet, and lets you experience things you never imagined possible as a scuba diver.

Who should take this course?

- Be at least 18 years of age.
- Have a PADI Open Water Diver and Enriched Air Nitrox certifications (or qualifying certification from another organization).
- Have a minimum of 25 logged dives.

What will I learn?

- Performing proper pre-dive checks.
- Developing the habit of keeping the loop closed when the mouthpiece is not in your mouth.
- Doing bubble checking, bailout drills, and handling other potential problems.
- Fine tuning buoyancy control.
- Monitoring displays and gauges.
- Post-dive procedures and disassembly.

What will I need?

- All PADI required course materials.
- Delayed Surface Marker Buoy (DSMB) and Reel
- Basic scuba gear, including a dive computer. Rigged bailout bottle (minimum 30CF)
 - Poseidon Rebreather
